And about those little buildings on either side of the schoolhouse.....That

first little boy, near us at the sidewalk corner on left, he's got that woolen cap pulled down over his eyes and knowing kids' habits, I'll bet his nose ought to be wiped. From what we see of the street here, the first step from the sidewalk corner must have been a doozey." (Caption by Rueben Gade)
