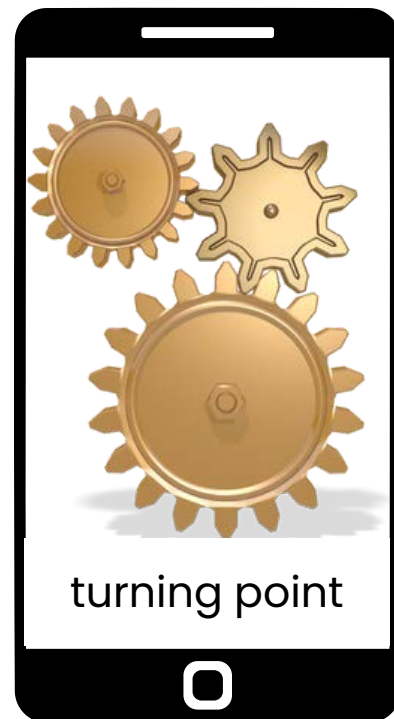


Flashcard instructions

Students can use the cards for study or create vocabulary games with them as a team or small group activity.

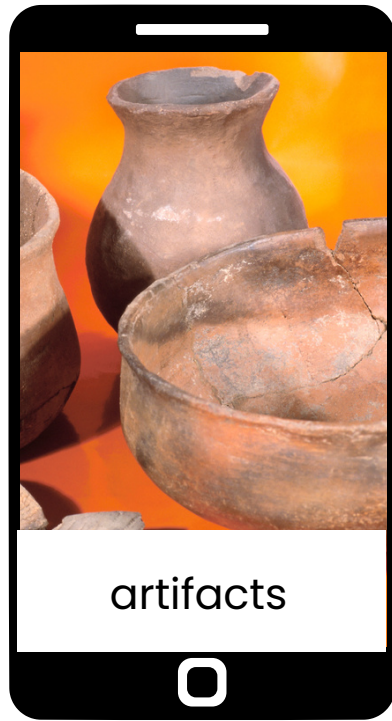
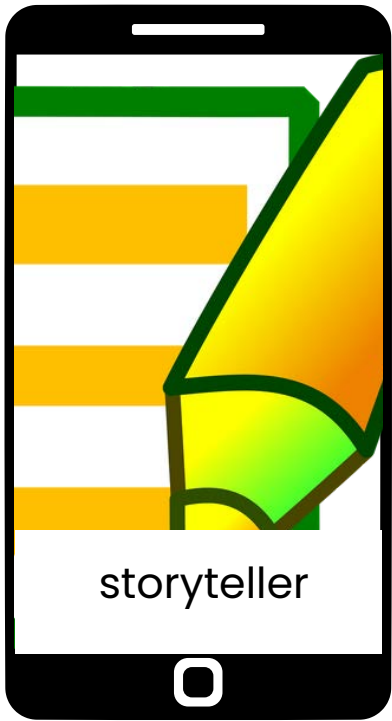
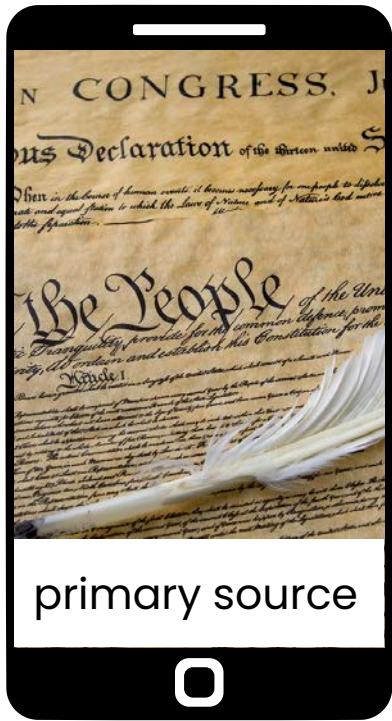
